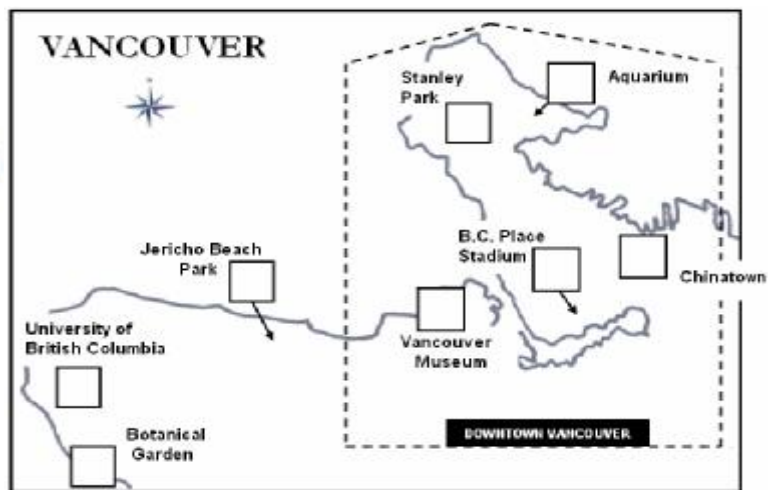

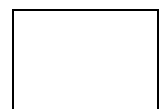

- Mum: That's a good idea. They are supposed to have a wonderful dolphin show ...
- Dad: But after watching all those fish I'll need a break. What about a picnic in a park?

- Daughter: Jericho Beach Park is only fifteen minutes from downtown – and it's a blast with its live concerts.
- Mum: Sorry, but I need a bit of peace and quiet. Besides, Stanley Park is closer to The Aquarium ...
- Son: Fine, here's the deal: We follow you to your *peaceful* park and you accompany us to the stadium afterwards. I'm dying to see this gigantic pillowy building.
- Daughter: As long as we don't have to watch a football match ...

### Avril Lavigne

- Virgin.net: Lovely Avril, welcome! Here at Virgin.net the rule is "the bigger the star, the bigger the love" – can you feel the love?
- Avril Lavigne: Oh definitely! Thank you for having me, and for the love.
- Virgin.net: It's a pleasure. So how are you? Are things still "complicated"?
- Avril Lavigne: Aaah no! At the moment everything is cool, life is good.
- Virgin.net: Wonderful, although it must be a little bit complicated to be 20 and one of the biggest stars in the world?
- Avril Lavigne: Oh, that's not a problem! It's not easy always being in the public eye but that's what comes with the job, you just learn to deal with it and try to get as much privacy as possible. You have to keep personal things to yourself.
- Virgin.net: You've become one of the most famous female singers in the world, are you worried that Britney or Christina Aguilera might try to have you secretly killed?
- Avril Lavigne: Oh dear, I hope not; I've never even met them so I hope they wouldn't have any bad feelings towards me. I don't have any opinions on them, we've never spoken so I don't think there are any bad feelings; I think I'm safe! They do their thing, and I do mine.
- Virgin.net: Your second album "Under my skin" seems different from your first one "Let go". Do you agree?
- Avril Lavigne: Yes, I do. The sound is different – maybe because there were several producers that worked on it.
- Virgin.net: Didn't you write and produce your songs all by yourself?
- Avril Lavigne: No, of course not. You can't do all the work by yourself. I wrote most of the songs for this album with my guitarist and back-up singer, Evan, during our 2003 world tour.
- Virgin.net: I think "Under my skin" is very emotional.
- Avril Lavigne: You're right, it is. I mean I've grown, I'm more mature. I've been through a lot – good and bad. You see, when my grandpa passed away two years ago, I was so sad. And that's why you can find some of these sad feelings in some of my songs.
- Virgin.net: Do you feel it's difficult to change your image as you mature?
- Avril Lavigne: Yeah, it is difficult. I'm changing as an artist, so I just hope that my fans will appreciate that and enjoy the music as it changes. I've been in this business since I was a young kid, things change, my taste in music develops all the time.
- Virgin.net: So if I take you on a date tonight, what music would you like to dance to? Do you follow new British music - any favourites?
- Avril Lavigne: I love a lot of bands over here, I think Oasis rock! I love to dance to anything that rocks! If it rocks, then I'll dance, there are lots of great bands over here.
